

A Few Words from your Ad Council...

We lost several longtime members and, in that grief, we found comfort and encouragement to find a new balance with them in our hearts and minds as we pressed forward. For me personally, losing Ada Honda was losing my true north. After generations of the Honda -Yamada connection I took it for granted that "Auntie Ada" would always be near to guide, mentor and love me, year after year. Ada was the one I spoke with for hours on end about the church and its connections. Ada has always been my history keeper and it was easy to get the information I needed by just calling, texting or visiting her. She was my true confidant, encourager and prayer partner. For our 120th celebration for Highland Park it was Ada who opened up her files of addresses and helped us in a way nobody else could. There was nothing I couldn't take to Ada. Once Ada hit 102 and she started to tell me what her expectations were of me, things changed. I knew she was ready to sit at the foot of Jesus and I knew she deserved that rest. The last year of her life was Ada who would give me marching orders where HPUMC is concerned. She reminded me of our history and made the isseis come alive every time she spoke of them. It will be difficult going forward without her, but I know I'll see her when it is my time to go.

Losing Alice Tanaka (Ad Council member, plus she held every position within our church structure at one time or another over the years) was also a death that broke our hearts. She has so much influence in our church and kept us going through all of our activities and fundraisers. At every loss of a church family member, we were reminded of the scripture in Revelation 21:4 "He will wipe away every tear from their eyes, and death shall be no more, neither shall there be mourning nor crying, nor pain anymore." What it must be like in heaven, living eternally with Jesus, who loved us all so much and who died for us.

People are crippled By feeling lost Walking towards God Not away is a must.


Taking the road To do what is right, Life has two ways One is dark, one is bright.
